Real-Life Dialogues

Dialogue 1 – A1 Level (Check-in)

Staff: Good morning! Where are you flying today?

Traveler: To Paris, please.

Staff: May I see your passport?

Traveler: Here you are.

Staff: Do you have any luggage to check in?

Traveler: Yes, one suitcase.

Dialogue 2 – A2 Level (Security Check)

Officer: Please take your laptop out of the bag.

Traveler: Do I need to take off my shoes, too?

Officer: Yes, please. Put your phone in the tray.

Traveler: Sure, here you go.

Dialogue 3 – B1 Level (At the Gate)

Traveler: Excuse me, is the flight to Paris delayed?

Agent: Yes, by about 45 minutes.

Traveler: Oh, will boarding still be at Gate 12?

Agent: Yes, please wait nearby.

Example Sentences

- I almost missed my flight because of traffic.
- The plane took off on time.
- We went through security and waited at the gate.

Real-Life Dialogues

Dialogue 1 – A1 Level (Check-in)

Receptionist: Welcome! Do you have a reservation?

Guest: Yes, under the name of Balıçam.

Receptionist: One double room for three nights?

Guest: That's right.

Dialogue 2 – A2 Level (Problem)

Guest: Excuse me, the air conditioner isn't working.

Receptionist: I'm sorry. I'll send someone to fix it.

Dialogue 3 – B1 Level (Check-out)

Receptionist: How was your stay with us?

Guest: Great, thank you. I'd like to check out.

Receptionist: Did you use anything from the minibar?

Guest: Just a bottle of water.

Example Sentences

- I'd like to book a single room for two nights.
- Could you fix the shower, please?
- The room wasn't as clean as I expected.

Real-Life Dialogues

Dialogue 1 – A1 Level (Asking for Directions)

Tourist: Excuse me, how can I get to the museum?

Local: Go straight and turn right. It's near the park.

Dialogue 2 – A2 Level (On the Metro)

Passenger: Does this train go to the city center?

Driver: Yes, it does. But it stops at every station.

Dialogue 3 – B1 Level (Taxi Ride)

Driver: Where would you like to go?

Passenger: To the Eiffel Tower, please. How long will it take?

Driver: Around 20 minutes, depending on traffic.

Example Sentences

- I got lost in the metro station.
- The taxi driver was very friendly.
- We walked to the hotel from the station.

Customer: Excuse me, is this soup spicy?

Waiter: No, not at all. It's mild.

Dialogue 3 – B1 Level (Paying the Bill)

Customer: Could I have the bill, please?

Waiter: Sure! Would you like to pay by card or cash?

Customer: Do you have this in medium?

Assistant: Let me check. Yes, here you go!



Dialogue 3 – B1 Level (Discount)

Customer: Is there any discount today?

Assistant: Yes, 20% off for all customers.
